Our transition into our roles has been a significant milestone for Kinbridge, and we're proud to have done so with unity and shared purpose. Together, we've crafted a new strategic plan that sets the course for our future endeavours.

We owe a debt of gratitude to our esteemed Board members, whose guidance and unwavering commitment have been instrumental in steering our organization toward success. Their wisdom and support have been invaluable as we navigated through transitions and embraced new initiatives.

None of our accomplishments would have been possible without the support and hard work of our exceptional staff and dedicated volunteers. Their passion and resilience have been the driving force behind every success we've achieved. In 2023, our volunteers contributed a total of 4951 hours, demonstrating their commitment to our community's well-being. We are profoundly grateful for their tireless efforts and contributions.

In our pursuit of Justice, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (JEDI) and Truth and Reconciliation (TR), we've made significant strides. Securing funding from the Canadian Red Cross enabled us to provide valuable training opportunities, fostering a more inclusive and understanding community. Kinbridge supported the community in 15 different languages in 2023, demonstrating our commitment to ensuring everyone feels welcome and valued.

In 2023, Kinbridge experienced a surge in community engagement, with 25,023 visits to our centers. Our commitment to fostering belonging and resilience was evident across all our programs and initiatives. From our Newcomer Program, providing tailored support for youth and older adults to navigate their settlement journey, to our dynamic youth programs and social enterprise efforts through YouthForce, each endeavour aims to empower individuals and create pathways to success.





With 98 recreation programs and diverse youth initiatives like the Leaders in Training program and basketball tournaments, we have nurtured a sense of community and personal growth. As we reflect on the year, we are proud to have facilitated connections, alleviated isolation, and provided vital support, embodying the spirit of inclusivity and empowerment at the heart of Kinbridge.

A recurrent priority expressed by our newcomer community was the need for support in securing employment opportunities. In response, we launched the Newcomer Employment Outreach program as a pilot initiative to address this crucial aspect of community empowerment. Through tailored employment readiness support for newcomers and targeted workshops for employers, we successfully met our projected annual targets within the first five months, highlighting the program's effectiveness.

Additionally, the launch of the Cambridge Neighbourhood Table (CNT) has brought our community together over shared meals and conversations. These gatherings, held weekly across multiple locations, embody our vision of nurturing connections within our neighbourhoods.

At Kinbridge, our mission is to facilitate sustainable social supports that help our neighbours reach their full potential, fostering vibrant, healthy communities where no one is left behind. Our values guide every aspect of our work, including our commitment to inclusion, celebration, and adaptability.


2023 Highlights





In 2023, YouthForce celebrated another remarkable year! With 36 youth employed, we provided opportunities for teens and young adults throughout the Waterloo Region to gain meaningful work experience and develop essential job skills. We secured 18 social enterprise contracts, furthering our commitment to supporting and uplifting the community.

Together, our dedicated team completed over 500 hours of hard work, significantly impacting the lives of our youth employees and the communities we serve. We look forward to another year of growth, empowerment through employment, and positive social change with YouthForce!





In 2023, Cambridge Neighbourhood Table (CNT) officially launched! CNT is a community initiative inviting neighbours to come together over a shared meal and conversation. In May, we launched the inaugural weekly meal at Forward Church. Then, in November, we expanded to two additional locations: Langs and the Freedom Centre. Now, we offer weekly meals on rotating Mondays and Tuesdays and every Friday, spreading nourishing meals and connections across our community. Over the next two years, our vision is to continue to partner with the community to hold a Cambridge Neighbourhood Table in a different neighbourhood across Cambridge, five days a week!



2023 Highlights



The Cambridge Newcomer Outreach Program tailors services for youth (aged 15-30) and older adults (aged 55+), aiming to foster connections and belonging within the community. Over the past year, the program has continued to alleviate isolation by providing essential access to settlement services through 8-week programs and bi-annual "Let's Be Neighbours" gatherings. As a result, participation from both demographics has consistently increased. Programs like Health and Wellness sessions and Conversational Circles have facilitated newcomers' adjustment to life in Canada.





In 2023, we recognized that many participants, particularly older adults and young mothers, have experienced war-related trauma. In response, we have introduced diverse trauma relief programs tailored to their needs. These initiatives include art therapy and collaboration with community health and wellness providers, ensuring participants receive comprehensive support to address these challenges.

Meanwhile, Kinbridge's Newcomer Employment Outreach Program remained steadfast in its commitment to assisting newcomers in Cambridge facing employment barriers, offering support throughout the year. Launched initially as a pilot project in partnership with the Waterloo Region Immigration Partnership, the program nurtured collaborations with diverse community partners and local employers to bridge the gap between employers and newcomer talents. Over the past year, the program facilitated two job fairs focused on newcomers, developed a tailored workshop series to enhance newcomers' skills and capacities, and provided direct job referrals.
